Language (English):

- Verbal by recognizing the alphabets, part of word building and vocabulary.
- Speaking expressively with complete sentences.
- Cultural literacy.
- Listen attentively and engage actively in a variety of oral language experiences.
- Respond appropriately and courteously to directions and questions.
- Participate in rhymes, songs, conversations and discussions.
- Read books appropriately and remember the word meanings.
- Recognize the print represents spoken language and conveys meaning such as his/her own name and signs such as Exit and Danger.
- Know that print moves left-to-right across the page and top-to-bottom.
- Understand that spoken words are represented in written language by specific sequences of letters.
- Phonics by identify long and short sounds/words.
- Match word with sounds or speech to print.
- Self-expression.
- Learn the vocabulary of school such as numbers, shapes, colors, directions, and categories.
